STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Ice Fishing by Non-Resident Fishermen.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows.

Section one of chapter sixty-six of the public laws of nine-
2 teen hundred and seventeen, as amended by chapter two
3 hundred and one of the public laws of nineteen hundred
4 and twenty-one, is hereby amended by adding thereto the
5 following sentence: 'provided, further, that the commis-
6 sioner of inland fisheries and game may, upon payment of
7 a fee of two dollars and fifteen cents by a non-resident of
8 this state for a special ice fishing license, issue to such ap-
9 plicant a special license authorizing him to fish through the
10 ice for landlocked salmon, trout, togue, black bass and white

11 perch in waters open to ice fishing in accordance with the
12 general law of the state,' so that said section as amended
13 shall read as follows:

'Section 1. Persons not bona fide residents of the state,
2 and not actually domiciled therein, except children under
3 sixteen years of age, shall not fish for, take, catch or kill
4 any kind of fish at any time in any of the inland waters of
5 the state, or have the same or any part thereof in posses-
6 sion, without first having procured a license therefor as
7 hereinafter provided. Such licenses shall be of such form
8 and style as may be prescribed by the commissioner of in-
9 land fisheries and game, and shall be issued by town clerks
10 and other agents appointed by said commissioner, under
11 such regulations as may be established by said commissioner,
12 upon application in writing on blanks to be furnished by
13 said commissioner, and payment of a fee of three dollars
14 and fifteen cents.

Provided, further, that the commissioner of inland fish-
2 eries and game may, upon payment of a fee of two dollars
3 and fifteen cents by a non-resident of this state for a special
4 ice fishing license, issue to such applicant a special license
5 authorizing him to fish through the ice for landlocked
6 salmon, trout, togue, black bass and white perch in waters
7 open to ice fishing in accordance with the general law of
8 the state.'
