S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Create a Game Sanctuary in the Town of Kenne-
bunk, to be Known as the Bragdon Wild Life Sanctuary.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall, except as herein provided, at
2 any time, hunt, pursue, shoot at or kill any wild animal or
3 any game or other wild bird within the following described
4 territory, situated in the town of Kennebunk, in the county
5 of York, viz:

Bounded beginning on the westerly side of the state high-
2 way leading from Kennebunk to Wells, about two hundred
3 fifty feet southerly from Brandy Brook; thence about north-
4 westerly to the Sanford Road at a point about four hundred
5 fifty feet southwesterly from Sinking Pond; thence by the

6 Sanford Road and Harriseeket Road about southerly to
7 Branch Brook; thence about westerly up the course of
8 Branch Brook to its intersection with the Boston and Maine
9 Railroad right-of-way; thence about northerly by the rail-
10 road to the Mousam River; thence down the course of the
11 Mousam River to the village of Kennebunk; thence by the
12 outer line of the compact portion of the village to the state
13 highway.

Provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall
2 not be construed to prohibit the trapping of wild animals
3 within the above described territory in accordance with the
4 general laws of the state.

Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to have in
2 possession at any time any wild bird or wild animal or part
3 or parts thereof taken in violation of any provision of this
4 act.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten or more than
3 three hundred dollars and costs for each offense or impris-
4 onment for sixty days or both said fine and imprisonment.

Sect. 4. The commissioner of inland fisheries and game
2 is empowered to enlarge the territory of this sanctuary upon
3 the written consent of the owners of the additional land to
4 be included.
