STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Authorizing James H. Kerr, of Rumford, in the County of Oxford, to Bring a Suit at Law against the State of Maine.

Resolved: That, whereas, James H. Kerr of Rumford 2 in the county of Oxford and State of Maine, who was the 3 contractor for the construction of the sub-structure of the 4 Hancock-Sullivan Bridge, finding that more work was need-5 ed than was embraced under the terms of the contract, 6 performed the same under the direction of the state high-7 way commission, and, while claiming compensation therefor 8 has not, in fact, been compensated, and he, the same James 9 H. Kerr, is hereby authorized to bring a suit at law in the

10 Supreme Judicial Court, within one year from the first day II of August, nineteen hundred twenty-seven, at any term 12 thereof for the county of Oxford against the State of 13 Maine, and the writ issuing out of said supreme judicial 14 court under the authority of this resolve shall be served 15 on the secretary of state by attested copy thirty days before 16 the return day thereof by the sheriff or either of his deputies 17 of any county of the State of Maine, and the conduct of 18 said suit shall be according to the practice of suits between 19 parties and suitors in the said supreme judicial court and 20 the liabilities of the parties shall be the same as the liabilities 21 between individuals, and any judgment that may be re-22 covered in such suit at law shall be payable from the treasury 23 of the State of Maine on final process issued by said supreme 24 judicial court in said suit at law out of any money not 25 otherwise appropriated and costs may be taxed for the said 26 Kerr if they recover in said suit.
