STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Salaries of the Chief, Captains and
Inspectors of the Police Department of the City of Lew-
iston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section fifteen of chapter thirty-seven of the
2 private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen,
3 as amended by section five of chapter seventeen of the pri-
4 vate and special laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, and
5 as amended by section one of chapter one hundred and
6 twenty-four of the private and special laws of the special
7 session of nineteen hundred and nineteen, is hereby amended
8 by striking out the words "twenty-one hundred dollars,"
9 and the figures "(\$2100)" in the second line of said section,

10 and inserting in lieu thereof the words, 'three thousand dol-
11 lars,' and the figures '(\$3000),' so that said section as
12 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 15. The salary of the chief of police shall be three
2 thousand dollars (\$3000) per annum, payable in equal
3 weekly instalment by the city treasurer. The chief of po-
4 lice shall be entitled to two weeks' vacation each calendar
5 year (with pay), the same to be taken when and as he may
6 desire. While upon said vacation, or when incapacitated
7 through illness, or absent from his office on the business
8 of the department, the duties of his position shall be as-
9 sumed by the captain on duty.'

Sect. 2. Section sixteen of chapter thirty-seven of the
2 private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven-
3 teen, as amended by section six of chapter seventeen of
4 the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and nine-
5 teen, and as amended by section two of chapter one hun-
6 dred and twenty-four of the private and special laws of
7 the special session of nineteen hundred and nineteen, is
8 hereby amended by striking out all of said section and sub-
9 stituting in lieu thereof the following:

'Sect. 16. Police captains shall each receive a salary of
2 twenty-four hundred dollars (\$2400) per annum payable in
3 equal weekly instalments by the city treasurer. The in-
4 spectors shall each receive a salary of twenty-two hundred
5 dollars (\$2200) per annum payable in equal weekly instal-
6 ments by the city treasurer.'

Sect. 3. Section nineteen of chapter thirty-seven of the
2 private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven-
3 teen, as amended by section eight of chapter seventeen of
4 the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and nine-
5 teen, is hereby amended by striking out all of said section
6 and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

‘Sect. 19. All witness fees and all other fees paid to the
2 chief of police, captains, inspectors, patrolmen and police
3 matron in their said capacities, from cases in the Lewiston
4 municipal court and in the superior court of the county of
5 Androscoggin shall be accounted for by them, and turned
6 into the treasury of the city of Lewiston when received by
7 them.’
