STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Taking of Clams in Addison.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of the town of Addison in the county of Washington, to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of said town.

Sect. 2. Persons not resident of the town of Addison may be permitted to dig for clams for fish bait or home consumption within the limits of said town, provided, however, that no person shall dig for purposes mentioned in this section during any one day more than one bushel of clams.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates the provisions of sections one

2 and two of this act shall, for each offense, be punished by
3 a fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars, or by imprisonment
4 for not more than thirty days.
