STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Providing a State Pension for Joseph A.

Trueworthy.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 Joseph A. Trueworthy, a pension of fifteen dollars per 3 month, payable quarterly, beginning July first, nineteen 4 hundred twenty-seven and continuing during the pleasure 5 of the legislature until otherwise ordered.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Trueworthy is a man sixty-two years of age. He sustained a paralytic shock quite a number of years ago so that he has no use of his lower limbs. For the past fourteen years he has been in a wheel chair. He has been attended by his faithful sister. He is very poor and has refused assistance from the town. Neighbors and friends are now assisting them.
