STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, for Teacher's Pension for Etta M. Patten.

Resolved: That there be paid to Etta M. Patten of
2 Corinna, a pension of two hundred dollars per year, payable
3 quarterly, from the fund appropriated for teachers' pensions,
4 beginning July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and
5 continuing during the remainder of her life.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This lady was born in eighteen hundred fifty-nine. She has taught in the public schools of Maine an aggregate number of years more than is required under the general law to receive state pension, but for two years she was a teacher in Massachusetts, hence her service in Maine was not continuous. She is physically incapacitated from going out and earning her livelihood in her profession.

She is receiving one hundred and fifty dollars now, and is asking for an increase of fifty dollars a year.
