STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

Ordered, the House concurring, that a committee com-2 posed of two senators appointed by the president of the 3 senate, three members of the house of representatives ap-4 pointed by the speaker of the house, representing employees 5 and employers subject to the workmen's compensation act 6 and the insurance carriers doing business in the state of 7 Maine, is hereby authorized and directed to make a full 8 investigation of all evidence and phases of the operation, 9 during the last ten years, of the workmen's compensation 10 law of this state, and all elements and phases of the cost 11 of workmen's compensation insurance in this state; and 12 make full report in writing to the governor on or before 13 October 1, 1928.

Such committee is hereby given full power to summons 2 witnesses and require the production of papers and docu-3 ments and records, such witnesses to receive the same at-4 tendance fees as obtains in the supreme judicial court.

Such committee is to serve without pay other than actual 2 expenses and is authorized to employ at the expense of the 3 state all necessary expert or other assistance.

To enable such committee to perform its duties the gov-2 ernor and council are authorized to pay the expenses of 3 this investigation and report, out of any moneys available 4 to the governor and council therefor.

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
