## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Clifford T. Kennedy of Vanceboro, for Reimbursement for Expenditures for Civil Suit Brought Against Him.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, to 2 be paid to Clifford T. Kennedy of Vanceboro, in the county 3 of Washington, the sum of five hundred ninety-two dollars 4 and eighty-eight cents, for reimbursement of the amount 5 expended by him, while a member of the state highway 6 police, in a certain suit brought against him by Howard 7 Jackson.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

As an officer of the State of Maine, Mr. Kennedy arrested Howard Jackson, charged with violation of the traffic laws. A civil suit was brought against him, by the said Jackson, and judgment was rendered in his favor. The judgment, costs, and expenses attendant upon the trial, aggregated the aforesaid sum.
