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## STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

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RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Lincoln for Support  
of State Paupers.

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Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to  
2 be paid to the town of Lincoln the sum of thirty-seven dol-  
3 lars and fifty cents, to reimburse said town for money ex-  
4 pended for support of Thomas F. Oak and family, state  
5 paupers, in the year nineteen hundred twenty-five.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

This family fell into distress in the town of Lincoln during the early part of 1925, and had assistance to the amount of \$37.50. The family left town very soon thereafter, and when they were next heard of, the woman and children were in the custody of the State Infirmary at Tewksbury, Massachusetts. It is impossible for the municipal officers to find any settlement for this family. Certainly they do not belong in Lincoln.
