STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Yarmouth.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of one hundred thirty-four dollars and thirty cents to 3 reimburse the town of Yarmouth for money expended for 4 the care and support of Theodore Davis and Ruth Lewis, 5 destitute children having no settlement in the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On November 2, 1924, there were abandoned in the town of Yarmouth, two children, Theodore Davis and Ruth Lewis, both being children of Florence Lewis, who had no known settlement in the state.

They were supported at an expense to the town of \$134.30 until March 2, 1925, at which date they were committed to the custody of the State Board of Children's Guardians, and the town asks to be reimbursed for the money expended.
