STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Washburn for Support of a State Pauper.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 be paid to the town of Washburn the sum of fifty-eight 3 dollars and fifty cents, to reimburse said town for money 4 expended for support of George H. Inman, a state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

George H. Inman met with an accident in the town of Washburn in April, 1926. Being without means, it was necessary for the town to provide for treatment of his wound; otherwise, he would have been left with a crippled hand. His parents were divorced a long time ago; he and his people have lived in many different places, and the selectmen of Washburn are unable to fix the liability upon any town.
