AN ACT to Provide for the Retirement of Firemen, in the  
City of Augusta, Upon Half Pay.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The city of Augusta is hereby authorized to  
2 provide for the retirement of all permanent members of its  
3 fire department, who have served in said fire department,  
4 for a term of at least twenty years, and who may have been  
5 honorably discharged from said municipal department of  
6 said city of Augusta, by reason of having attained the age  
7 of sixty-five years or by reason of permanent injuries or  
8 permanent physical incapacity, which is the result of an

9 incident of service in said fire department, upon a pension  
10 of half pay.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect and be in full force,  
2 when approved by a majority vote of the inhabitants of  
3 said city, qualified to vote in municipal affairs, at the next  
4 legal annual meeting, held after the first day of December,  
5 in the year nineteen hundred twenty-eight. For the pur-  
6 poses of said meeting, the city clerk shall reduce the subject  
7 matter of this act to the following question: "Shall the act  
8 relating to the retirement of firemen upon half pay, be  
9 accepted" and the voters shall indicate by a cross, placed  
10 within a square upon their ballots, over the words "Yes"  
11 or "No" their opinion of the same.
