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## STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

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AN ACT to Regulate Fishing in the Outlet of Grand Lake,  
So-called, Wholly or Partly in Forest City, So-called, an  
Unorganized Township in the County of Washington.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

So much of section eighteen of chapter two hundred and  
2 nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven-  
3 teen, as amended, as prohibits fishing, in accordance with  
4 the general law of the state applying to fishing for protected  
5 fish, from September fifteenth to September thirtieth, both  
6 days inclusive, of each year, for landlocked salmon, trout,  
7 togue, black bass and white perch, in the waters between  
8 the dam at Forest City, so-called, in Washington county,  
9 down to Joe Lewey's Carry, so-called, on Mud Lake, so-  
10 called, in Washington county, said waters being on the  
11 boundary between Maine and New Brunswick, s hereby  
12 repealed.
