AN ACT Relating to Juvenile Institutions.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Chapter one hundred and forty-four of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the following sections :

'Sect. 34. The trustees of the State juvenile institutions, may, with the approval of the governor and council, retire from active service the superintendent of the state school for boys, or any other officer or employee of said school and place them upon a pension roll, provided that such superintendent or other officer or employee has been employed in the service of the state school for boys, with a good record, for the term of thirty years, or who, after

9 twenty years of continuous service in said state school for  
10 boys, has attained the age of sixty years.

Sect. 35. A superintendent or other officer or employee  
2 who is retired as above provided, shall be allowed a pen-  
3 sion which shall be paid from the state treasury, equal to  
4 one-half the salary he was receiving at the time of his re-  
5 tirement. A superintendent or other officer or employee  
6 shall only be retired and pensioned as above, upon the  
7 recommendation of the board of trustees of the State ju-  
8 venile institutions, approved by the governor and council.'
