S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Mary J. French
of Carmel.

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month be,
2 and hereby is, granted to Mary J. French, of Carmel, to
3 be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers
4 and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first,
5 nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until
6 otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mary J. French is the daughter of David Hewey, who served in Co. E, First Maine Regiment of Heavy Artillery, during the Civil war, from August 9, 1863, to September 11, 1865. She is 72 years old. Her health is very poor and she has no means of procuring a livelihood. She lives alone and has no children who are able to assist her in any way.
