STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Emily Noddin
of Kenduskeag.

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month be,
2 and hereby is, granted to Emily Noddin, of Kenduskeag, to
3 be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers
4 and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first,
5 nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until other-
6 wise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Emily Noddin is the daughter of David Hewey, who served in Co. E, First Maine Regiment of Heavy Artillery, during the Civil War. She is 70 years old and in very poor health. There is no chance that she will ever be any better. She has no means of earning anything, and it is necessary that some provision be made to help her.
