STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Louise D. Mayhew of Mount Vernon
in Lieu of Teacher's Pension.

Resolved: That there be allowed and paid out of the ap-
2 propriation for the payment of teacher's pension, to Louise
3 D. Mayhew of Mount Vernon in the county of Kennebec,
4 the sum of two hundred (\$200) dollars per annum during
5 the lifetime of the said Louise D. Mayhew, the same to be
6 in lieu of any teacher's pension to which she might be en-
7 titled under the law as it now exists, to be paid in equal
8 quarterly payments.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The within named applicant is 76 or 77 years of age, and in a state of impaired health, living alone at Mount Vernon, Maine.

She graduated from the Farmington State Normal School in 1869; and began teaching immediately thereafter; and taught continuously till April 1876, when she was sick, and did not resume actual teaching in public schools till 1878, and then taught continuously till sometime during the year 1884.

During the school years of 1884 and 1885 she took and completed a post graduate course in Farmington State Normal School, graduating therefrom June 1885.

She then resumed teaching, and taught several terms in the town of Mount Vernon, Maine.

In 1889 she went to the Industrial School at Lancaster, Mass., where she was employed for several years.

While her duties there were not confined strictly to teaching, the work was along those lines, and it was a school supported by the state.

Since returning, she has taught several terms in Maine, and in all has taught something over seventeen (17) years close time, but covering a much longer period from start to finish.

Her business was purely teaching from 1869 to and including 1889.

She was for several years employed in the State School at Hallowell and part of the time as matron.

She recently, or only a short time ago, taught a term in this state.
