STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Trapping of Fur-Bearing Animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Paragraph one of section fifty of chapter two hundred 2 and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred seven-3 teen, as amended by chapter two hundred and forty-four 4 of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, as 5 amended by chapter one hundred and ninety-six of the 6 public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, and as 7 amended by chapter fifty-five of the public laws of nineteen 8 hundred twenty-five, is hereby amended to read as follows: 'Sect. 50. Whoever hunts, captures or traps any fur-

2 bearing animal, or animals, except bobcats, loupcerviers or
3 Canada lynx, in any of the unorganized townships of the
4 state shall annually procure a license therefor from the
5 commissioner of inland fisheries and game, paying therefor
6 a fee of ten dollars.

Provided, further, that whoever hunts, captures or traps 2 any beaver in any territory opened to beaver trapping by 3 said commissioner shall pay therefor a fee of twenty-five 4 dollars annually. Each person licensed under the provisions 5 of this section shall, on or before the fifteenth day of De-6 cember of each year, make such report to said commissioner 7 as may be called for by him.

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall pay 2 a fine of one hundred dollars and costs for each offense.'
