RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of North Yarmouth.

Resolved: There is hereby appropriated the sum of forty2 five dollars to reimburse the town of North Yarmouth under
3 and in accordance with the provisions of section one hun4 dred twelve of chapter four of the revised statutes for
5 money paid by said town on November four, nineteen hun6 dred twenty-six to reimburse Fred Titcomb, an inhabitant
7 of said town for five lambs killed by dogs belonging to an
8 unknown owner.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Fred W. Titcomb of North Yarmouth owned a flock of thirty-five sheep which he kept in his pasture. On April 7, 1925, these sheep were chased by dogs belonging to an unknown owner. Five of these sheep were exhauted by the dogs and between April 7 and 13 three of them dropped their lambs all dead, two pairs of twins and one single. These were the only lambs that came dead from the entire flock. The selectmen are of the opinion that the death of these lambs was unquestionably caused from the sheep having been chased by the dogs.
