HOUSE ORDER Relative to Investigation of the Hydro-Electric Powers of the State of Maine.

ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that a recess com-2 mittee, consisting of eleven members appointed as follows: 3 one member appointed by the governor, one member from 4 the senate, appointed by the president of the senate, one 5 member appointed by the minority leader of the senate, two 6 members from the house, appointed by the speaker of the 7 house, one member appointed by the minority leader of the 8 house, two experts, one on engineering and one on finance, 9 appointed by the governor, president of the senate and 10 speaker of the house jointly, one member appointed by the 11 master of the state grange, one member appointed by the

12 state chamber of commerce, one appointed by the Hydro-13 electric companies of the state of Maine, be named, whose 14 duties shall be to consider the matter of the exportation of 15 electricity from the state and ascertain the further develop-16 ment and utilization of the water power resources of the 17 state in order best to conserve the public interest and to 18 accomplish the efficient and complete development of such 19 resources. In making such investigation, the committee shall 20 examine and consider the reports and information made or 21 obtained by other committees, commissions and departments 22 as the result of investigation relating to water power; but 23 the commission may make such further and additional in-24 vestigation as it may deem necessary. Said committee shall 25 report the result of its investigation, with its recommenda-26 tions, to a special or next regular session of legislature. 27 Any vacancies in said committee shall be filled by the re-28 spective officers appointing the same. Said commission is 29 authorized to employ counsel, auditors, engineers, stenog-30 raphers and such clerical assistance as it deems necessary. 31 Said commission shall serve without compensation but shall 32 be reimbursed its actual expenses. It is further ordered 33 that the expense of such investigation shall be paid from 34 funds in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated or 35 from the state contingent fund.
