STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Permit County Commissioners to Establish a
County Farm.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The county commissioners of any county are
2 hereby authorized, if in their judgment public interest so
3 requires, to establish a county farm at the expense of the
4 county and to have the general superintendence, manage-
5 ment and control of said county farm and of the land and
6 buildings, officers and employees thereof and of the inmates
7 confined therein.

Sect. 2. In any county where such county farm is estab-
2 lished and maintained, any town in said county may, under
3 such rules and regulations as may be established by the

4 county commissioners, remove its paupers to the farm and
5 board them therein. The expense of maintenance shall be
6 borne by the towns having paupers at said farm in propor-
7 tion to the number of paupers therein, or in such other
8 manner as the county commissioners may determine.
