## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Pensions for the Blind.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter one hundred and forty-eight of the revised stat-2 utes as amended by chapter three hundred of the public laws 3 of nineteen hundred and seventeen and chapter seventy-4 two of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one 5 is hereby further amended by adding at the end of said 6 chapter the following section:

'Sect. 20. Whenever the benefits granted by the governor 2 and council under this act are insufficient, the cities and 3 towns in which such persons reside may grant additional 4 aid to such persons without creating any pauper disabilities, 5 and the expense of such additional aid shall be borne by the

6 cities and towns in which such persons respectively have 7 a settlement. Cities and towns are hereby authorized to 8 raise money for the purpose of granting such additional 9 aid. Any blind person shall not acquire a settlement or be 10 in process of acquiring a settlement while receiving such 11 aid from his city or town. It shall be unlawful for over-12 seers of the poor to maintain blind persons in a poorhouse.'
