STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Prohibit the Bedding, Advance Baiting, Feeding or Corning, So-called, of Wild Ducks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. It shall be unlawful for any person at any
2 time to bed, feed or corn, so-called, or put out any food of
3 any kind for any variety of wild ducks for the purpose of
4 enticing them to any place or locality for any purpose.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 be subject to a penalty of thirty dollars and costs for each 3 offense, or imprisonment for sixty days.

Sect. 3. The provisions of this act shall not be construed 2 as prohibiting the department of inland fisheries and game 3 from granting permits to fish and game associations, or to

4 inland fish and game wardens, to provide food for wild 5 ducks, when climatic conditions require such attention, or 6 to plant wild rice or other suitable duck food in waters 7 which need a supply of such food.
