STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Joseph H. Underwood for Damages Caused by Beaver.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) in favor of 3 Joseph H. Underwood of Fayette, Maine, for damages 4 done to his property by beaver.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

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On the land of Mr. Underwood the beaver built two houses, the result of which, with their cuttings for the houses, was to injure a large amount of poplar and to cause other damages to Mr. Underwood's land. The beaver have been in that vicinity for some ten years and have caused more or less damage to property by flowage and cutting of trees. The beaver practically stripped all the poplar off a large portion of Mr. Underwood's land and, although the Fish and Game Department opened up the place for trapping, the damage which has been caused to him can not be compensated except through this resolve to the Legislature.

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
