## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Lydia A. Bodfish, of Elliottsville Plantation.

Resolved: That a pension of fifteen dollars per month be, 2 and hereby is, granted to Lydia A. Bodfish, of Elliottsville 3 Plantation, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions 4 for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin 5 July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue 6 until otherwise provided by the legislature.

# STATEMENT OF FACTS

Lydia A. Bodfish is the widow of Nymphas Bodfish, who served in Company C, 11th Regiment of Maine Infantry, during the Civil War, and was disabled in the line of his duty. She is eighty-four years old and does not receive any Government pension.
