## STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Authorizing James H. Kerr of Rumford in the County of Oxford to Bring a Suit at Law Against the State of Maine.

Resolved: That James H. Kerr of Rumford in the county 2 of Oxford and State of Maine, who was the contractor and 3 builder of the sub-structure of the Hancock-Sullivan bridge, 4 claiming that he has not been fully compensated therefor, is 5 hereby authorized to bring a suit at law in the supreme ju-6 dicial court, within one year from the first day of August, 7 nineteen hundred twenty-seven, at any term thereof for the 8 county of Kennebec against the State of Maine, and the 9 writ issuing out of said supreme judicial court under the

10 authority of this resolve shall be served on the secretary of
11 state by attested copy thirty days before the return day
12 thereof by the sheriff or either of his deputies of any county
13 of the State of Maine, and the conduct of said suit shall be
14 according to the practice of suits in the said supreme ju15 dicial court and the liabilities of the parties shall be the same
16 as the liabilities between individuals, and any judgment that
17 may be recovered in such suit at law shall be payable from
18 the treasury of the State of Maine on final process issued
19 by said supreme judicial court in said suit at law out of any
20 money not otherwise appropriated and costs may be taxed
21 for the said Kerr if he recover in said suit.
