STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Kingman for Support
of Ed. Priest, a State Pauper.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to
2 be paid to the town of Kingman, the sum of fifty-three dol-
3 lars and seventy-four cents, to reimburse said town for
4 money expended for support of Ed. Priest, a state pauper,
5 in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Ed. Priest was born in Township No. 39 (Hancock Tannery), on Jan. 20th, 1897. His father's family lived at the above-named place and had support as state paupers for a number of years prior to his father's death. There is no record that Ed. Priest has ever acquired a settlement since he became of age. He is unable to give the length of time that he has lived in different places, but there is very little probability that he remained in any one place five years. His wife had a settlement in the town of Kingman at the time of their marriage, and the town officials consider that she still holds that settlement, and that her husband (Ed. Priest) is without settlement.

The amount called for by this Resolve is one-half of the amount paid out for provisions.
