STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend Chapter Three Hundred Ninety, Private
and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred Seven, Entitled
"An Act to Incorporate the Livermore Falls Water Dis-
trict."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifteen of chapter three hundred ninety, of the
2 private and special laws of nineteen hundred seven, entitled
3 "An Act to Incorporate the Livermore Falls Water Dis-
4 trict," is hereby amended by adding to the first sentence of
5 said section the words, 'provided, however, that the trustees
6 may from time to time, in their discretion, and subject to
7 review by the public utilities commission on its own mo-
8 tion or on complaint under chapter fifty-five of the revised

9 statutes, establish meter rates and require the use of meters
10 throughout said territory, or in any part or parts thereof,
11 so that the first paragraph of said section, as amended, shall
12 read as follows:

‘Sect. 15. All individuals, firms and corporations, whether
2 private, public or municipal, shall pay to the treasurer of
3 said district the rates established by said board of trustees
4 for the water used by them, and said rates shall be uniform
5 within the territory supplied by the district; provided, how-
6 ever, that the trustees may from time to time, in their dis-
7 cretion, and subject to review by the public utilities com-
8 mission on its own motion or on complaint under chapter
9 fifty-five of the revised statutes, establish meter rates and
10 require the use of meters throughout said territory, or in
11 any part or parts thereof. Said rates shall be so estab-
12 lished as to provide revenue for the following purposes:’
