STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of William H. Hall of Augusta, Maine.

Resolved: That there be paid to William H. Hall of 2 Augusta, Maine, the sum of two hundred eighty-five dollars 3 and eighty-five cents (\$285.85) for injuries received while 4 working at the Augusta State Hospital, by being struck by 5 an inmate of said institution.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On July 14th, 1926, I was working at the coal dock of the Augusta State Hospital, unloading coal to be used at said hospital. While in the performance of this duty, without any provocation, an inmate of said hospital struck me with a shovel on the left elbow, breaking the skin and driving coal into my arm, which caused infection of said arm. Because of said injury I was compelled to be out of work for four weeks and was confined to the Augusta General Hospital for fifteen days. I lost in wages, one hundred forty dollars (\$140.00) and my expenses include a hospital bill of ninety-three dollars and fifty cents (\$93.50) to the Augusta General Hospital, a bill to Dr. Warren B. Sanborn for services of forty-four (\$44.00) dollars, a bill for services to Dr. V. T. Lathbury for six (S6.00) dollars and a bill to John Coughlin for medicine of two dollars and thirty-five cents (\$2.35), making a total in expenses of one hundred forty-five dollars and eighty-five cents (\$145.85).
