RESOLVE, to Reimburse the City of Bangor for Support of  
Oscar L. Morrill, a State Pauper.

*Resolved:* That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to  
2 be paid to the city of Bangor, the sum of three hundred  
3 thirty-four dollars and ninety-five cents, to reimburse said  
4 city for money expended for support of Oscar L. Morrill,  
5 a state pauper.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Oscar L. Morrill has had help in the city of Bangor at several different times. He is about fifty years of age. He claimed that he had worked in woods camps at various places for the past twenty years or more. Prior to that, he served in the Regular Army for two or three years, and is said to have been a deserter. He left Bangor in July, 1926, and his present whereabouts are unknown. The city of Bangor, because of its location, is obliged to help these transient woodsmen in many cases without being able to find out where they belong.
