STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Winterport Ferry Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section three of chapter forty-eight of the private and
2 special laws of eighteen hundred eighty-seven is hereby
3 amended by striking out the whole of said section after the
4 word "namely" in the third line thereof and inserting in
5 place thereof the following: 'for each foot passenger, twenty-
6 five cents; one vehicle of any kind drawn by one horse, and
7 two persons, one dollar; the same drawn by two horses, and
8 two persons, one dollar; and for each additional horse with
9 any of the carriages aforesaid, twenty-five cents; each addi-
10 tional person, fifteen cents; for each yoke of oxen with or
11 without cart or sled, and driver, one dollar each; all other

12 neat cattle and beasts of burden, thirty cents each; sheep,
13 swine and smaller animals, six cents each; one automobile
14 with not over two persons, one dollar; each additional per-
15 son, ten cents; one truck of one ton capacity with or with-
16 out load, one dollar; one two ton truck, without load, one
17 dollar; with load not exceeding two tons, two dollars and
18 one dollar per ton for each additional ton,' so that said sec-
19 tion, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 3. A toll is hereby granted and established for the
2 use of said corporation, according to the following rates,
3 namely: for each foot passenger, twenty-five cents; one
4 vehicle of any kind drawn by one horse, and two persons,
5 one dollar; the same drawn by two horses, and two persons,
6 one dollar; and for each additional horse with any of the
7 carriages aforesaid, twenty-five cents; each additional person
8 fifteen cents; for each yoke of oxen with or without cart
9 or sled, and driver, one dollar each; all other neat cattle
10 and beasts of burden, thirty cents each; sheep, swine and
11 smaller animals, six cents each; one automobile with not
12 over two persons, one dollar; each additional person, ten
13 cents; one truck of one ton capacity with or without load,
14 one dollar; one two ton truck, without load, one dollar; with
15 load not exceeding two tons, two dollars and one dollar per
16 ton for each additional ton.'
