RESOLVE, in Favor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians for the General Care, Maintenance, and Education Thereof.

Penobscot Tribe of Indians, Care and Maintenance.

- 2 Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from
- 3 the state treasury to be expended, under the direction of
- 4 the governor and council, by the agent of the Penobscot
- 5 Tribe of Indians, for the benefit of said Tribe, for the year
- 6 from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, to June
- 7 thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, and for the
- 8 year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, to
- 9 June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, as follows:

Amounting to twenty-seven thousand, thirty-five dollars 2 and fifty-five cents, for the year from July first, nineteen 3 hundred and twenty-seven to June thirtieth, nineteen hun-4 dred and twenty-eight; and twenty-seven thousand, thirty-5 five dollars and fifty-five cents for the year from the first 6 of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight to June thirtieth, 7 nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

And be it further resolved, that any balance of any of the 2 subdivisions above named and not required for the purpose,

- 3 may, upon recommendation of the state auditor, be trans-
- 4 ferred by the governor and council to pay bills against any
- 5 of the above subdivisions, where bills may have been con-
- 6 tracted in excess of the amount above set forth.
