STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the City of Bangor for Support and Burial Expenses of Maud Ward, a State Pauper.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 be paid to the city of Bangor, the sum of four hundred and 3 ten dollars, to reimburse said city for money expended for 4 support and burial expenses of Maud Ward, a state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Maud Ward was a weak-minded person. She could not give sufficient information to enable the overseers of the poor to fix the responsibility for her support upon any town. She became destitute in Bangor, and the overseers of the poor could not do anything but take care of her. She died early in the year 1926, and was buried at the expense of the city. She had no known relatives.
