STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Regulate Fishing in Certain Brooks in the Town of Durham, in the County of Androscoggin, and the Towns of Freeport and Pownal, in the County of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, 2 catch, or kill any trout at any time in any part of the 3 following named brooks or streams: Branch brook and its 4 tributaires in said Durham, from its source to Harrington 5 bridge, so called; Newell brook and its tributaries in said 6 Durham, from its source to the bridge on the highway lead- 7 ing from South Durham to West Durham, known as the 8 Bliss bridge; that part of Harvey brook and its tributaries 9 in said Pownal which is above the forks, so called, of said

10 brook, said forks being near the boundary line of said Pow-
11 nal and said Freeport.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to fish for, take,
2 catch, or kill any trout in any part of any of the aforesaid
3 streams being in said Durham, Freeport or Pownal, other
4 than the parts hereinbefore designated, except on Monday,
5 Wednesday and Friday of each week during open season,
6 on brooks provided by the general laws of the state.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to take, catch or
2 kill from said waters in any one day more than fifteen fish
3 in all or not exceeding ten pounds of fish in all (unless the
4 last fish taken increases the combined weight thereof to
5 more than ten pounds).

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine
2 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars
3 and costs of prosecution for each offense, and in addition
4 thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had
5 in possession in violation of any of the provisions of this
6 act.
