STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the City of Bangor for Support of
Thomas Burns, a State Pauper.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be
2 paid to the city of Bangor the sum of one hundred ninety-
3 nine dollars and two cents, to reimburse said city for money
4 expended for support of Thomas Burns, a state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Thomas Burns claims to have been born in Providence, Rhode Island, in 1856. He has worked in the woods in many different places in the State of Maine for nearly forty years until he became disabled in the latter part of the year 1925. The claim was not settled in the usual way for the reason that it was supposed that he had a settlement in Portland, which proved to be incorrect.
