## STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Clerk of Courts in Lincoln County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty of chapter one hundred and seventeen of

- 2 the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended
- 3 by striking out the words "twelve hundred" in the thir-
- 4 teenth line thereof, and inserting in place thereof the words
- 5 'eighteen hundred dollars,' so that said section as amended
- 6 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 40. The clerks of the judicial courts in the several

- 2 counties shall receive annual salaries from the treasurers
- 3 of the counties in monthly payments, paid on the last day
- 4 of each month as follows:

Androscoggin, twenty-two hundred dollars.

Aroostook, two thousand dollars.

Cumberland, twenty-eight hundred dollars, deputy clerk 2 of courts two thousand dollars.

Franklin, fifteen hundred dollars.

Hancock, twenty-one hundred dollars.

Kennebec, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Knox, eighteen hundred dollars.

Lincoln, two thousand dollars.

Oxford, eighteen hundred dollars.

Penobscot, twenty-five hundred dollars. .

Piscataquis, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Sagadahoc, twenty-one hundred dollars.

Somerset, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Waldo, twelve hundred dollars.

Washington, sixteen hundred dollars.

York, twenty-five hundred dollars.

The sums above mentioned shall be in full compensation for 2 the performance of all duties required by clerks, including 3 those performed by them as clerks of the supreme judicial 4 court, superior and county commissioners' courts or by clerks 5 pro tempore employed by them and the sum provided for the 6 clerk in Lincoln county shall be in full for all such services 7 and also in full for services as clerk of Lincoln municipal 8 court, except as provided in section forty-five of chapter

9 eighty-two of the revised statutes.
They shall account quarterly under oath to the county

2 treasurer for all fees received by them or payable to them 3 by virtue of the office, except fees collected by them in 4 naturalization proceedings under the act of congress of 5 June twenty-ninth, nineteen hundred and six, as amended 6 by the act of congress of June twenty-fifth, nineteen hun-7 dred and ten, specifying the items, and shall pay the whole 8 amount of the same to the treasurers of their respective 9 counties quarterly, on the first days of January, April, July 10 and October of each year.'
