STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Reed Plantation for Support of a State Pauper.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 be paid to Reed Plantation the sum of four hundred and 3 twenty-five dollars and five cents, to reimburse said planta-4 tion for money expended for support of Hattie E. Black, 5 otherwise known as Hattie E. Flinn, a state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Hattie E. Black, otherwise known as Hattie E. Flinn, has no pauper settlement in the State of Maine. The reason why this account has not been paid by the State is that the assessors of Reed Plantation did not file proper vouchers.

This woman has been supported as a state pauper ever since leaving Reed Plantation. She is now living at Stacyville.
