STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Kingman for Support of Thomas Robichaud, a State Pauper.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to

- 2 be paid to the town of Kingman, the sum of two thousand
- 3 five hundred and sixty-one dollars and fourteen cents, to
- 4 reimburse said town for money expended for support of
- 5 Thomas Robichaud, a state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Thomas Robichaud is a Canadian, and claims to have been born in the year 1859. He was never naturalized in this country, never married, never had any property and never remained in any one place long enough to acquire a settlement. His work has been that of a common laborer, in the woods and around the mills. He lost a leg in February, 1920, and has been taken care of since that time by the town of Kingman.

The debt of the town of Kingman is ten per cent of the valuation, and the tax rate last year was .068.
