STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the City of Old Town for Support
of Joseph Pelkey, a State Pauper.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to
2 be paid to the city of Old Town, the sum of fifty-five dol-
3 lars, to reimburse said city for money expended for support
4 of Joseph Pelkey, a state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

At the time this expense was incurred the city of Old Town made a claim against the state, but it was not allowed for the reason that it was thought that Mr. Pelkey had a settlement in the town of Connor. It has since been learned that he had no settlement in the state and the city of Old Town should, therefore, be reimbursed by the state under the general law providing for support of state paupers. A resolve is necessary because the claim is too old to be taken care of in any other way.
