RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Castine, for Reimburse-
ment of Money Paid Out for Care of State Pauper.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to
2 be paid to the town of Castine, the sum of five hundred
3 sixty-six dollars and seventy cents to reimburse said town
4 for the care of Mattie Chamberlain and family, state pau-
5 pers, from the year nineteen hundred ten to the year nine-
6 teen hundred and twenty-six inclusive.

The amount called for in this resolve was discovered to be due the town of Castine during an audit of the town books, which showed a discrepancy between the cash on hand and balances of various accounts.

The town has paid out, during the period mentioned, the sum of five thousand two hundred twenty-six dollars and twenty-seven cents, and received from the state the sum of four thousand six hundred fifty-nine dollars and fifty-seven cents.

This discrepancy doubtless arises because of the fact that claims sent the state have not always included all of the bills which the town has paid. A complete statement, showing dates of town orders, amounts of same, to whom drawn, and for what purposes, will be filed with the committee.
