STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Webster for Support
of Paul Pomeroy and Wife, State Paupers.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to
2 be paid to the town of Webster, the sum of seventy-four
3 dollars and ninety-six cents, to reimburse said town for
4 money expended for support of Paul Pomeroy and wife,
5 state paupers.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Paul Pomeroy and wife came to the town of Webster about July 1, 1925. He was given a ninety day jail sentence for some violation of the liquor laws. His wife was destitute and out of employment, and it was necessary for the Overseers of the Poor to furnish aid. Pomeroy came from Canada, and claimed that he belonged in Rangeley Plantation. As Rangeley Plantation is not required to support paupers, there does not seem to be any reason why the State cannot properly assume this bill.
