STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Ice Fishing in Cochnewagon Pond, in
Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,
2 take, catch or kill, at any time, and kind of fish on or through
3 the ice in Cochnewagon pond, which pond is situated in the
4 town of Monmouth, in the county of Kennebec, except it
5 shall be lawful to fish in said pond through the ice for pick-
6 erel and white perch, with not more than five set lines to
7 a family, in the day time, when under the immediate per-
8 sonal supervision of the person fishing, on Saturday of each
9 week, during February and March of each year.

Sect. 2. It shall also be unlawful for any person or family

2 to take, catch or kill in said pond more than fifteen pounds
3 of pickerel and white perch in all, in any one day, while
4 fishing through the ice, or to have in possession in any one
5 day more than fifteen pounds of pickerel and white perch
6 in all so taken in said pond.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more
3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and one dollar
4 additional for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in pos-
5 session in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 4. In all prosecutions arising under this act, trial
2 justices, police and municipal courts within their counties
3 shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent juris-
4 diction with the supreme judicial court and superior courts.

Sect. 5. So much of the existing rules and regulations of
2 the department of inland fisheries and game, relating to ice
3 fishing in said Cochnewagon pond, as is inconsistent with
4 the provisions of this act is hereby repealed.
