STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Possession of Forbidden Implements for Hunting and Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-five of chapter two hundred and nineteen

- 2 of the public laws of nineteen hundred seventeen, as amend-
- 3 ed by chapter one hundred ninety-six of the public laws of
- 4 nineteen hundred nineteen, is hereby amended by striking
- 5 out all of said section and by substituting therefor the fol-

'Sect. 25. No person shall expose or offer for sale, sell
