#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Appropriate Money for Compiling and Advertising the Agricultural, Industrial and Recreational Resources of the State.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) for the 3 fiscal year from July 1, 1927, to June 30, 1928; and the sum 4 of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) for the fiscal 5 year from July 1, 1928, to June 30, 1929, to be used and 6 expended solely for compiling, publishing and distributing 7 literature and data regarding the agricultural, industrial and 8 recreational resources of the State of Maine, and for ad-9 vertising said resources in newspapers and magazines; said 10 sums to be expended under the direction of this Legislature 11 through a special publicity committee of five members con-

12 sisting of two senators appointed by the president of the 13 senate, and three members of the house of representatives 14 appointed by the speaker.

No claim, account or demand against the state for com-2 piling, publishing or distributing any of said literature and 3 data shall be approved by the state auditor, or paid from 4 the state treasury, unless and until the same shall have first 5 been authorized by or consented to by a majority of said 6 special committee in writing.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

This resolve is to provide an appropriation for the purposes concisely stated therein. It will supplement, co-ordinate and carry forward the publicity work undertaken through appropriations made by cities and towns, as authorized by present law (R. S. Ch. 4, Sec. 59, as amended) to advertise their natural resources, advantages and attractions.
