STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Taking of Smelts in the Georges River and its Tributaries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter 66 of the Special Laws of 1913 be hereby amended 2 by striking out all sections of said Chapter and substituting 3 the following:

'Section I. No smelts shall be taken or fished for in any 2 of the tidal waters of Georges River or its tributaries above 3 a direct line drawn from Hooper's Point in the town of St. 4 George to the southwest point of Gay's Island in the town 5 of Cushing, except by hook and line, and except that smelts 6 may be taken in Oyster River and at Warren by the usual 7 method of dipping with hand nets from the twenty-fifth 8 day of March in each year to the twenty-fifth day of April.

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'Sect. 2. Whoever violates the provisions of section one 2 of this act shall be punished by a fine of one hundred dollars 3 for each offense to be recovered by complaint, indictment 4 or action of debt, and in addition to said fine all boats, gear 5 and all devices used in violation of this act shall be seized 6 and become the property of the state.

'Sect. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this 2 act are hereby repealed.'
