STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend "An Act to Incorporate the Division of
Maine, Sons of Veterans."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Amend section one of chapter one hundred and sixty-two
2 of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and
3 eighty-seven by striking out in the second, third and ninth
4 lines on page two hundred and five the words "Sons of
5 Veterans of the United States of America" and "Sons of
6 Veterans" and inserting in lieu thereof the words 'Sons of
7 Union Veterans of the Civil War,' so that said section as
8 amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. Frank P. Merrill, Augustus S. Libby, Chas.

2 H. Rice, John C. Blake, Edward K. Gould, Chas. O. Wads-
3 worth, Geo. A. Fields, Waldo H. Perry, Horace L. Wright,
4 Samuel H. Dill, Fred E. Pottle, David A. Friend, David
5 O. Brown, Albert M. Pitcher, Geo. B. Hodgdon, Edward
6 J. Hatch, Fred W. Pliasted, their associates and successors,
7 be and hereby are made a body politic and corporate by
8 the name of the Division of Maine, Sons of Union Vet-
9 erans of the Civil War, for the purpose and object of keep-
10 ing green the memories of the soldiers of the Union, and
11 their sacrifices, for its maintenance; to aid the members
12 of the Grand Army of the Republic in caring for helpless
13 and disabled veterans and their widows and orphans, and
14 to encourage the proper observance of Memorial Day, and
15 also to assist needy members of the Sons of Union Veterans
16 of the Civil War; said corporation may sue and be sued,
17 defend and be defended, make and have all by-laws and
18 regulations which may be necessary for the management
19 of affairs, nor repugnant to the laws of this state, and shall
20 be vested with all the powers and privileges and be subject
21 to all the liabilities by law incident to corporations of a
22 similar nature.
