STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of a Road Leading from Long Pond to Rockwood and from Tarratine to Greenville.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the 2 sum of five hundred thousand dollars to construct a high-3 way leading from Long Pond to Rockwood and from Tar-4 ratine, so called, to Greenville.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This road is about thirty-five miles in length. People coming from Quebec to eastern Maine, take a circuitous route and travel one hundred thirty miles to reach Moosehead Lake, whereas, if this road is built, they would have but forty miles to travel. This road was laid out and money appropriated therefor by the legislature of nineteen hundred fifteen but the same has not been completed.
