STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend Section One of Chapter Three Hundred and Eleven of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Seventy, Relating to the Oquossoc Angling Association.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter three hundred and eleven of the
2 private and special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy
3 relating to the Oquossoc Angling Association is hereby
4 amended by striking out the words "to the value of twenty
5 thousand" in the seventh line of said section, and by striking
6 out the word "dollars" in the eighth line of said section, so
7 that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 1. William P. Frye, Nathan Cutler, William S.
2 Badger, George Shepard Page, Jay Cooke, Daniel Dodd and
3 A. D. Lockwood, their associates and successors, are hereby
4 constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the
5 Oquossoc Angling Association, for the purpose of angling,
6 propagating fish and shooting game; with power to hold by
7 purchase, lease or otherwise, real and personal property, and
8 to lease, sell and convey, or otherwise dispose of the same;
9 to adopt a code of by-laws not inconsistent with the laws of
10 this state, and to do and perform such other acts and things
11 as may be necessary for the promotion of the objects of the
12 organization.
