STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Schools Being in Session before the Hour
of Eight of the Clock in the Forenoon.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No school, common or high, shall be in session
2 before the hour of eight of the clock in the forenoon.

Sect. 2. Any town or city, in which its said schools are
2 in session prior to eight of the clock in the forenoon, shall
3 receive no financial aid from the state for the entire year
4 in which said schools are so in session.

Sect. 3. Any person believing that any school, in any town
2 or city, has been in session at a time prior to eight hours of
3 the clock in the forenoon, may file a complaint, to that effect,
4 with the treasurer of state, who shall withhold from such

5 municipality, for the time being, any aid from the state,
6 which it would otherwise receive. He shall forthwith notify
7 the commissioner of education who, thereupon, shall cause
8 to be made, an investigation of the complaint and, if such
9 complaint is found to be true and his decision thereon shall
10 be final, he shall certify his findings to the treasurer of state,
11 who shall withhold aid to such town or city as is provided
12 in section two hereof.
